#### Mary Thompson's Buttermilk Biscuits

-from Jane Thompson

2 cups flour 2 tsp baking powder 1 tsp salt 1/2 tsp soda 3 tbs shortening

3/4 to 1 cup buttermilk

Sift dry ingredients.

Rub in shortening.

Add enough buttermilk to make a soft dough. Knead dough five or so times on floured board. Roll out dough and spread with shortening or margarine.

Fold over double. Cut with biscuit cutter. Melt a tablespoon of shortening in a biscuit pan. Grease top of biscuits by dipping in melted shortening. Cook, greased side up, for 12 to 15 minutes in 450 degree oven.



#### SEPTEMBER MONTHLY MEETING

September's Monthly Meeting will be held on Tuesday, September 13, 2005, commencing at 7:00 p.m. at the North Village Library, 2139 W. Anderson Lane in Austin.

September's speaker will be Mark Loewe, Ph.D. His speech is titled, "Are Texas' TAKS math and science scores trustworthy?" Several questions from Texas' TAKS math and science tests will be presented that raise questions about the trustworthiness of the TAKS scores reported by the Texas Education Agency. Additional questions are raised about the trustworthiness of the Texas Education Agency.

Dr. Loewe has a Ph.D. in Physics, as well as a B.S. in Physics and a B.S. in Chemistry. He is coauthor, with Arno Bohm, of a quantum mechanics textbook that has been used throughout the world, including for graduate level physics courses at schools in the University of California and University of Texas systems and in the Ivy League. Their 1986 edition was translated by the Soviets into Russian. Unauthorized copies were printed in Red China and South

Korea.

When not pursuing research in theoretical physics and chemistry, Dr. Loewe works to improve our education system. He proposed and gave invited testimony on Texas House Bill 689 (Garnet Coleman and Kent Grusendorf, 2003 Session), which would allow children to permanently keep low-cost math and science textbooks. Dr. Loewe also proposed a progressive variant of school vouchers under which all children would benefit from part of the tens-of-billions of additional private dollars that would be attracted into our education system.

Dr. Loewe is a member of the Atheist Community of Austin.

Directions:

From Hwy 79 in Round Rock, go east on 79 past the Dell Diamond. At the next intersection with a 4-way traffic light, go right onto CR 122. Go over the bridge and take the first street on the left. It is CR 123. Go about a mile and take the first right into Oak Bluff Estates – the street is Twin Ridge Parkway. Pass 2 stop signs and then go right into the 2nd street - Ridge Run. At the end, go left onto Forest Mesa. #4 has a long driveway and trees in front of the house.

From Gattis School Road in Round Rock, turn onto 122 from Gattis School Road. The intersection has a traffic light with a Walgreens on one corner, a gas station on another, and a shopping center with a gas station and Albertson's on another.
