

See you at future activities!



Book Donations for Hurricane-hit Libraries --Update

The October monthly package from the National Office includes a Project Inkslinger request and guidelines for book donations to replace books lost due to the recent hurricanes. Two places were listed. One is the Texas Library Association, www.txla.org, in Austin TX. We have been asked to suspend shipment of books to the TXLA for the time being. They have already received over 60,000 lbs of books, and have no room left for others. In the coming months they will sort and distribute what they have, and will then inform us of libraries still in need in the TX, LA, MS, area. I will let you know of shipping addresses when they are available. They would still enjoy financial donation to help with their costs.

The other place listed is Reader to Reader Inc., www.readertoreader.org, in Amherst MA. I called there a few minutes ago. They have not been affected by the flooding in the Northeast, and will be happy to receive books from us. Please note their specific request for science/educational/history/poetry and similar books.

Please let your Local Group members know of the temporary halt to TXLA, and the continuance of book and/ or financial donation to Reader to Reader.

Lonestar Mensa ExComm Meeting Minutes

October 5, 2005

Attending: Janet Kres, President; Midge Kocen, Treasurer; Margaret Wofford, Member at Large; Don Drumtra, Member at Large; and John Neemidge and Helen Siders, Members.

Janet convened the meeting at 6:10pm.

As the new President, Janet shared her goals for LSM. She would like to focus on regular testing to build membership and she wants the group to be socially active with fun activities. She also thanked the members of the ExComm for their contributions to the group.

When Janet became President upon Karen Werner's resignation, the Vice President spot became vacant. As Treasurer, Midge automatically became Vice President, but she immediately resigned. Janet reappointed Midge as Treasurer and appointed Margaret to fill the vacant Vice President position. Janet then appointed Helen to fill Margaret's vacant Member at Large position.

Attendees discussed the difficulty that Paul Anderson, chair of the nominating committee, is having filling the ballot for 2006 ExComm positions.

Attendees discussed possible locations for the holiday party.

Janet proposed to buy inexpensive Mensa items to give to any new or transferred in 2005 member attending the holiday party. Moved, Margaret, seconded, Midge, to allot \$200 from general funds for Janet to buy the gift items. Motion passed unanimously.

Janet also proposed to buy inexpensive Mensa items to give to test proctors and volunteers. Moved, Don, seconded, Helen, to add these items to the Action Still in Effect (ASIE) regarding purchases of officer recognition pins and officer name tags. Motion passed unanimously.

Janet reported that she has been contacted by two women in College Station regarding the possibility of administering a Mensa test there. Moved, Don, seconded, Midge, to reimburse proctors for travel to distant locations to test a minimum of three people. Reimbursement for mileage will be at the Texas state government rate and \$10 will be allowed for lunch. The proctor must request approval for reimbursement from the LSM President before the travel occurs. Motion passed unanimously.

Attendees discussed the ASIE regarding RGs at length and proposed several changes. The issue was tabled to allow Janet

time to incorporate the changes into her draft copy.

Janet reported that she has reserved the North Village Library for the second Wednesday of the month for monthly meetings through July 2006.

Midge presented the Treasurer's Report for August and attendees briefly discussed Margaret's draft of the 2005 RG financial statement.

Janet adjourned the meeting at 7:40pm.

There were 675 folks who took advantage of the free prior evidence evaluation in August. We are still waiting for the results of the evaluations. I expect we have another free prior evidence review event, as this seems to have been very successful.

At the September AMC meeting a motion concerning carpooling and roommate matching was passed. Local groups are strongly encouraged to create a web site for roommate matching and carpooling. Any who request roommates or carpooling are to be directed to that web site.

My wife and I just learned of the death of a friend. She is the sixth friend we have lost in recent years. It is deeply moving to realize just how short our time on earth will be. I wrote this for Christine, a dear Mensa friend who was taken from us much too soon. Giving my thoughts a form helped me to come to terms with my feelings. I never expected that I would need it again so soon.

"When I heard of her death, I didn't believe it. It must be some kind of mistake. She is so young. Women are not supposed to die so young.

And yet, it could not be denied. She was taken from me. She had shared with me that she had cancer. She didn't go into details and I didn't want to impose by asking. I never realized that it would take her away from me. Why? Why would someone so young be taken? I miss her. I miss her smile, her humor, and her enthusiasm. I felt I had been

robbed. Why did this happen? What kind of God allows this to happen?

I switched back and forth between anger and gloom. It is not fair that such good people are taken from us. If there were a higher deity, he would not allow such things. Why did she have to have cancer?

A few weeks after her death, her family had a memorial for her. I was among her friends and coworkers who were invited. Her family came to Dallas not only to share with us our grief, but to share a joy in whom she was. That's when we learned how brave she was. She had a very virulent form of cancer. She hid her pain from us. Her death was a release from that pain. I felt ashamed for how selfish I had been. My thoughts were focused on what I lost. I didn't think of her suffering and that for her death was a welcome relief. I had finally reached acceptance."

One of the biggest benefits we receive from membership in American Mensa is our Mensa friends. We don't treasure enough what we have until we realize how easily we can lose it.
