

February Monthly Meeting

February's presenter is Doug Foster. He'll speak on "Where to place blame for the Savings and Loan Crises of the 1980s: fraud or Congress". The root causes of financial losses, who really benefited and implications for today.

Doug Foster is a 20 year veteran of the Texas Savings and Mortgage Lending Department serving in various capacities. He completed all the training for designation as a commissioned safety and soundness examiner in 1985 and as a compliance examiner in 1992. He was named Director of Examination in June of 2003 expanding the oversight duties he already had for state savings banks to include the examination of mortgage brokers. In September 2003 Doug was appointed Deputy Commissioner and served for four months as Interim Commissioner until the appointment of Commissioner Danny Payne on January 1, 2004. Prior to his employment with the Department, Doug worked for several years as a branch manager and loan officer for a small savings and loan and began his career working for a credit union. A graduate of the University of Texas, at Austin, Doug and his wife Shari reside in Lockhart. One interesting fact about Doug; he has spent two summers in Israel doing biblical archaeology.

Region 6 Report

We have a new Mensa forum. You can access the forums at: http://www.us.mensa.org/community/forum. Give it a try and you may find something of particular interest to you.

We have three months before the annual dues renewal. Please help reduce expenses by renewing early. This is a time when we lose almost one in five members. While there are valid financial reasons why some do not renew their membership, surveys indicate that the most common reason is that they simply didn't receive enough perceived value for their membership. The majority of folks we lose are first year members.

When I was a local group membership officer, we asked new members why they joined Mensa. The dominant answer was to meet and interact with intelligent people. Our challenge is how do we facilitate interaction with our new and inactive members. A study of member participation characteristics indicated that folks prefer activities within ten miles of their home or business. We need to have regular geographically diverse activities as well as an active new member involvement program. Since eating is a significant common interest, meetings at restaurants for breakfast, lunch, dinner or evening drinks are very popular.

To urge each group to work toward facilitating improved member retention, I am offering two prizes (groups > 200 members and groups < 200 members as of 3/31/06). The large and the small group with the smallest percentage of lapsed members as of April 1, 2006 will receive a \$50 reward. In addition, the Loc Sec of each winning group will be asked to nominate the five members who did the most to achieve member retention. Each of these nominees will receive a Mensa Service Award pin.
