






October Monthly Meeting

Topic: Landscape Design and Composting with the Texas Department of Transportation

Presenter: Barrie Cogburn

Barrie Cogburn, RLA, Director, Landscape Design & Enhancement Section with TxDOT will discuss landscape design and the use of compost. TxDOT has been providing landscape design for over 70 years. In 1998 she began a partnership with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality which focused on the research, development and implementation of utilizing compost as an effective erosion control alternative in high construction and maintenance. This partnership effort resulted in one of the most progressive compost utilization programs in the country and included the largest Clean Water Act grant ever awarded by the EPA. The effort was awarded the 2002 American Association of State Highway & Transportation Officials President's Transportation Award – environmental Category and the 2002 National Partnership for highway Quality, Texas Quality Initiative – Making a Difference Award. TxDOT is currently the nation's largest market for compost.

Barrie received her Bachelor of Science in Landscape Architecture from Texas A&M University in 1983 and is a Registered Landscape Architect. She is an active member of Executive Women in Texas Government. Barrie was the recipient of the 2003 Raymond E. Stotzer Jr. Award for outstanding leadership, dedication and service to the state in the field of transportation.
