Edelstein's Gems

Have you ever wondered who and where your fellow Mensans are? As an experiment, we extracted some interesting statistics from the October membership list from the National Office . The age demographic sorts out as follows:

Our youngest and oldest members are ages 8 and 85, respectively.

It appears we must have a fairly high turnover in membership, with perhaps $\frac{1}{2}$ to 1/3 of those who join dropping out after a while. 41 of us have been members since before 1980, 58 joined in the 80's, 63 in the 90's, 139 between 2000 and 2005, 157 between 2006 and 2008 and 98 are new members this year. With 98 new members, we should be seeing more faces, as people try out at least one local event, but most new members never attend anything at all. 65 of us are Life members.

In our group are 15 households with more than one member, accounting for 32 of our 567 members, and the active participation in Mensa events is proportionately higher in the households with more than one member than it is among the rest of our group.

Our group is the 30th largest out of 135 groups in the country. Gulf Coast (Houston area), with 1,067 members is number 11, and North Texas (Dallas area) at 1,044 is 12th. South Texas is 34th.

Most of us, 300, live in the city of Austin, with another 24 in Cedar Park and 33 in Round Rock, 8 in Pflugerville. Outside of Austin there are 30 in Georgetown, 21 in College Station, 10 each in Bryan, Temple, and Waco. The other 121 members are living in 63 different central Texas towns, some of them quite close to Austin and some not located near any of our larger population groups. 40 of our members have no other members living in their home town. This gives an interesting perspective to the makeup of Lonestar Mensa.

We cover a large geographic area and are certainly a diverse group.

One of the things the age demographic points out to me is that we need to be more aggressive in recruiting younger members. The 19-29 number is of special interest—if we can just get them involved with LSM activities. And if they don't show up and don't voice their concerns, we can't respond and try to meet their needs/ desires. The 30-39 group is also a source of special opportunity for involvement. But don't let this scare off the others—we need everyone to be involved.

Speaking of which...IT'S ELECTION TIME! Get involved! Those of you who have submitted your names for an elected position, we thank you. Those who didn't, VOTE! Those who vote basically run the organization. If you don't vote, don't complain about how things are run. There are or soon will be, two ballots for you to consider. The first, which went out with the October newsletter, is for the new bylaws. PLEASE VOTE! The second is for the persons running for elected positions on the Executive Committee (ExComm), the governing body for LSM. PLEASE VOTE!

LonestaRG 2009 Scholarship Financial Report -submitted by Don Drumtra, RG Treasurer

Raising money for scholarships is one of the primary goals of LSM RGs. This year the Scholarship Program received \$139 from the raffle compared with \$53 from the raffle last year. It also received \$10 from donations and \$28 from disbursements for a total of \$177. In previous years, raffle activities may have been hampered by a lack of presentation, advertizing, and integration with other RG activities before and during the RG. The raffle activities were better integrated this year than previous ones. Many thanks to Valerie Kaiser for her leadership and Claudia and Artemis Harbert for their extra effort in selling raffle tickets. This report was submitted to the RG Chair and ExComm per paragraphs 6d and e of ASIE 2007-10-1 and was adopted on October 7.

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Bylaws Amendment Election

After the ballot was published in the October issue, Vice President Don Drumtra raised concerns about the election process. To correct those concerns the following instructions shall apply to the submission of those ballots related to the Bylaws Amendment Election:

1. The ballot that was published in October must be used and will not be published this month to comply with the current Bylaws which say "A mail ballot must be published in the issue of the LSM newsletter that follows publication of the proposal." The proposal was published in September, the ballot in October. This ballot may be printed if it was received electronically. It may be photocopied if received in hard copy if, as Don, you want to keep a copy of the newsletter intact for posterity.

2. Because Don did not want to require use of the actual printed ballot to verify that each person who votes is eligible to vote and votes only once, the instruction for election of officers shall apply.

If you have already mailed your Bylaws ballot, please resend following these instructions. After all, you have until November 27 for the Bylaws and only November 15 for the officers. So it should not cause a timing problem to remail the ballot. The current Bylaws do not address when the polling procedures must be published so this amendment complies with them. My sincerest apologies if this is inconvenient for you. I am truly sorry for the communications errors that caused the need for this clarification.

POLLING REQUIREMENTS-SUBMISSION OF BY-LAWS BALLOT

3. Place your bylaws election ballot in a blank envelope and seal it. Put this envelope in a second envelope and write or type your name, address and Mensa membership number so that they are "clearly legible" on the outside of the second envelope. Proposed Bylaws--One Member's Thoughts

First I read the current 2005 Bylaws, then I read the Proposed Bylaws. What a difference!!! The 2005 Bylaws are so clear, easy to read, unambiguous and not contradictory.

The Proposed Bylaws appear to be either modeled after a maze or the Gordian knot. A real puzzle! It is hard to know where to start—if it isn't broke, why break it?

I think the most ill-advised change in the Proposed Bylaws is delegating the authority to manage the financial assets of LSM to the Treasurer. Managing, or deciding how to use, the money is a function that should always be separated from receipt of money, possession of it and disbursement of it which are the other functions for which the Treasurer is responsible. Separating management of money from possession makes it more difficult to walk away with money because it takes at least two people working together to do it. To combine these functions in a single person/office is leaving the door wide open to embezzlement—or are all Mensans too honest for that? Even if they are, the auditor would look askance at it.

The next issue is that words in the Bylaws are used to mean so many different things in different places that it is a real challenge to determine what the By-Laws are talking about—should this be a test? Two examples:

• the word "Secretary" There are lots of things that the Secretary must do but there is not an officer who is just called the Secretary—there is a Local Secretary and there is a Vice President Secretary. Which one is responsible if the By-Laws just say Secretary?

• the word "officer" is used to refer to elected, appointed, part of the Board, not part of the Board, some persons given titles, some who have no title that I can find, and each of these has different terms of "office," qualifications, etc.

Why make Mensa members responsible for participating in the local group in the Bylaws? When I joined, I was told that one of the neat things about Mensa was that members could do as much or as little as they wanted to do? Are you now dumping guilt for not participating? Besides, is legislating participation likely to work?

What does "appoint succeeding officers to vacant or potentially vacant positions to serve the remainder of succeeded officers' terms" mean? Sounds like you are going to appoint my successor to fill the remainder of

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my successor's term. Shouldn't that be the remainder of my term if he is my successor? Aren't I the "predecessor"? Or is this another test to see if "obtuse" constructions work? And how do you know when to fill my position—after all it is always potentially vacant—I mean, I might get hit by a bus on my way home and then it would be vacant—so isn't it potentially vacant all of the time?

Transition from Current to Proposed Bylaws?

The Bylaws say that the elected officers serve staggered two year terms from April 1 of the year elected until March one or two years after the year of election. Each year how do you know how many elected officers serve for two year terms that end the first March 30th after the election. And which electeds get the two year terms that end one year later? Seems like the term should be either one year or two for every one elected each year but I guess they could draw straws.

Each year the number of officers elected is determined by the official membership number at the end of March of the preceding year. There is no provision for electing more than 5 officers in a single year—not even the year in which the by-laws are adopted. Seems to me that someone thought that they had said that there would be twice as many officers elected in the year of adoption and the split between one and two year terms was probably only meant to apply to the year that the Proposed Bylaws are adopted. BUT unfortunately, the Proposed Bylaws do not say that.

I have barely scratched the surface of the confusion I found in the Proposed Bylaws but I have already taken up too much space.

October ExComm Minutes

The regular monthly meeting of the Lonestar Mensa Executive Committee (ExComm) convened at 6:05 PM, October 7, 2009, at the Northwest Community Center, 2913 Northland Dr., Austin, TX. Attending were: President Ron Edelstein Chairman; Vice-President Don Drumtra Secretary; Treasurer Patty Drumtra; and Members-at-Large Paul Anderson, Kathie Lawler, and John Neemidge. The ExComm approved without debate the agenda and the September 9 ExComm minutes published in the September Armadillo Literary Gazette (ALG) page 6.

Ron announced his acceptance of the resignations of Ellen Lukasik as Testing Coordinator effective October 17 and Helen Siders as Circulation Manager effective October 9. Both positions will be vacant and he is looking for volunteers. He also announced his appointments of Michael Tolbert as a Proctor and Don Drumtra as acting Circulation Manager, assisted by Kathie, Ron, and Linda Edelstein.

Patty reported that at the end of the third quarter LSM is in good financial health. The ExComm adopted the report without debate. Financial reports are available to members on the LSM Website and by request; quarterly are also published in the ALG.

Kathie, Communications Chair, reported that she is considering revising the process for managing the news cycle, newsletter content, and calendar content. Ron reported on his recent conversations with the post office on improving our newsletter mailing process. The ExComm approved an expenditure of \$105 for USPS compliant mailing seal tabs for the news letters. Ron distributed the latest alias list from the National Office and asked all to review it. Don, Officer Coordinator, agreed to consolidate the inputs, compare them with the Officer and distribution lists and forward the recommended changes through Ron to the NO.

The Education and Membership Committees had no Report.

Ron reported for the Symposia Committee that the annual Christmas Party has been scheduled for December 12 at Coffee a Deli, 111800 N. Lamar. Attendance will be \$10 payable at the door with the SymCom picking up any remaining cost. Soft drinks, beer and wine will be available. John, LonestaRG 2009 Chair, reported that RG feedback forms were positive with only a few negative comments. The final financial result was \$275.25. He expects to present his final report at the November Ex-Comm meeting. The ExComm adopted a separate report on RG Scholarship results that Don, RG Treasurer, presented showing that generous RG participants donated \$177 to LSM scholarships through the raffle and other activities. The report is available on line and in this ALG.

John also reported that LonestaRG 2010 participation is continuing to grow. We now have 22 registrations and \$800. We are still looking for an RG chair.

Don announced the next regular monthly ExComm meetings were scheduled for 6-7 PM, November 4 and December 2 (the first Wednesdays), at the Northwest Recreation Center multipurpose room. ExComm meetings are open and all Mensa members may attend. The meeting adjourned at 6:55 PM.

LSM Program Activity Statement -- September 2009

<u>Third Quarter 2009 Financial Report</u> January 1 through September 30

-submitted by Patty Drumtra, Treasurer

Looking at the Year to Date 9 months columns in Table 1, Program Activity Summary, we can see that the program revenue is close to expectations except for undistributed revenue. Our reduced membership and low interest rate continues to impact the undistributed account. The best rate we could get for CD2 at our current bank was 1.6% compared to the current rate of 4.2% for CD1 last year. Hopefully the situation will improve as we get more members and the economy improves. Nevertheless, expenses remain low so we can continue to spend money for our programs. The expenditure rates resulted in the large contribution to assets shown at the bottom of the table. Our 2009 RG was successful with overall gain of \$275 distributed from the RG. Table 2, Balance Sheet, shows our assets continue to grow as do our liabilities. The scholarship raffle and other activities resulted in \$177 increase in our Scholarship escrow. Our other liability will increase through the year as we continue to replenish the scholarship escrow and as the 2010 RG registrations add to the RG escrow. Our net worth continues to grow. The ExComm adopted this report on October 7.

Touring the Old Bergstrom Homestead at Green Gate Farms

Are you interested in learning more about our food supply by visiting a local urban farm? Please join us for a tour of Green Gate Farms, just 8 miles east of downtown Austin. The tour will begin at 12 noon on Saturday, November 7, so please plan to arrive a few minutes early. Green Gate Farms grows 75 kinds of vegetables, raises about 90 animals, and uses sustainable and organic farming practices. A farmer will guide us through the historic 1902 mulebarn built by the Bergstrom family, walk the fields, and discuss livestock. There is a requested donation of \$5 per person for the tour. Please wear closed-toed shoes and consider wearing a hat and sunscreen.

As this article goes to print, the farm is unsure if their onsite farm stand will be open this fall. Farming is a tough business, and this season they had to contend with the severe drought and then too much rain during planting season. In November they hope to have cabbage, broccoli, kales, turnips, tomatoes, basil (lemon, lime and Genovese), green beans, and squash available. They always have pork and eggs available for purchase as well.

This outing is family friendly, but we welcome everyone to attend. Please feel free to bring friends along!
