#### Don's Dialectics - Just Do It --- Three

In my June and July "Dialectics" (before I was co-opted by the AG bubble), I suggested that members who wanted to become active in Lone Star Mensa activities they should volunteer—they should just do it. But what if one only wants to become active a little bit? What if one only wants to stick a toe in the water? It is possible to be partially active?

The short answer is yes. Our bylaws read that Lone Star Mensa members, "are responsible to their fellow members for participating in local group and other Mensa activities through their service, presence, dues, and/or gifts." This statement was questioned in the ALG by one of our members who wrote, "When I joined, I was told that one of the neat things about Mensa was that members could do as much or as little as they wanted to do? Are you now dumping guilt for not participating?" Yes and no. Yes-members can do as much as or as little as they want and the bylaws are not dumping guilt on the members for not participating. However, there is one important exception—members must pay dues to remain members. If they do not and still represent themselves as a Mensa member, then they should feel guilty that they do not pay for the privilege. Rather than dumping guilt, the bylaws article tries to get at the idea that there are many ways of participating—levels of becoming active from, a little bit to a lot. One can choose. What are examples? Well, here are some,

- 1. The minimum--you pay your dues and bask in the glory of being a card carrying member of Lone Star Mensa, American Mensa, and Mensa International—one of the smartest people in the world.
- 2. The above plus you read the newsletter and/or Website maybe occasionally maybe more often. You might even occasionally stop in for a glass of lemonade at a TGIT or attend another activity of Lone Star Mensa.
- 3. The above plus you volunteer for a short activity involving something you like. One member likes games so she hosts them in her home. Another member hosts picnics. We recently had visitors from Spain who wanted to explore the music scene in Austin. Within 12 hours after the notice to our members went to the membership, six volunteers offered to host the visitors and provide support to their visit.
- 4. The above plus you undertake a longer commitment as a member or chair of a special committee for an activity such as our bid committee for Mind Games in

2012 or our RG committee each year.

- 5. The above plus you assume a year long commitment to be an activity coordinator or a standing committee chair.
- 6. And finally you could can do all those things plus assuming a two-year commitment to be an elected board member of Lone Star Mensa.

These are examples of the kind of activities you might want to consider if you want to become more active. You do not have to do any of them except pay your dues. But we all hope that we will have enough volunteers to do most of them. If you want to become more active, just do it.

If you haven't already done so, please consider opting in for electronic newsletters by going to the Profile Update page located at www.us.mensa.org/profileupdate. The phrasing on the profile page will be 'electronic publications, if available'. There is a one to two month lag before your paper newsletters stop being snail-mailed and the e-newsletters start floating through the ether to your PC.

#### City of Austin Water Treatment


With Al Sarria's thought provoking presentation on the future of the Austin smart grid for power distribution, we wrapped up our series of presentation on energy portion of Climate Protection in the City of Austin. In this series Austin Energy planners and engineers took us through the overall program including green alternatives for power generation, commercial and residential solar cell alternatives, Austin electric vehicles, the residential rebate program for carbon reduction, and the smart grid all with a view of where we are today. We still have handouts from these visits that are available at each general meet-

ing until they run out. We are particularly grateful for the presenters taking their time to visit with us and for Leslie Schneiweiss Sopko who selected the speakers and worked hard to get their schedules to match ours. Thanks to all.

In July, Jill Mayfield introduced the water portion of our presentation series with an overview of how the City of Austin gets its water, how drinking water is processed, and what we do with the waste. The next two programs will provide us more detail on new innovations for water treatment and the future management of liquid and solid waste to accommodate the growing population of

Don moved to amend ASIE 2007-1 to clarify Symposia Committee Coordinator responsibilities and titles by substituting the word "Events" for the word "Symposia." The board unanimously adopted the motion after debate and amendment. (The amendment is ASIE 2010-18.)

On behalf of the RG Committee, Linda reported the status and progress of the RG, 2010.

The meeting adjourned at 7:16 PM.

#### <u>August Board Minutes</u>

The regular monthly meeting of the Lonestar Mensa Board of Officers convened at 6:00 PM, August 3, 2010, at Ron Edelstein's home, 1439 Dapplegrey Lane, Austin, TX 78727. Attending were: Ron Edelstein, Don Drumtra, Patty Drumtra, Linda Edelstein, and John Neemidge. The Board adopted the agenda without debate. The July 13 minutes were read and adopted as corrected to insert "ASIE" before "2010-18."

Linda presented the Financial Report for July, 2010. The Board approved the report without debate. Financial reports are available on the Website.

On behalf of the RG Committee, Linda reported the status and progress of the RG, 2010.

On behalf of the Communications Committee, Don provided a report on the printing and postage costs of the ALG Newsletter from January 2009 through August 2010. In summary, postage costs have fallen 50 percent

over the period and, correcting for the additional costs for hand folding, printing costs have fallen slightly. The report's spreadsheet is posted on the Website.

On behalf of the Membership Committee, Don reported that five out of eight scheduled Mensa candidates completed tests at the July 24 session. In summary, future test sessions are scheduled for September 4 at the RG, October 16 (Mensa National Testing Day), and December 4.

On behalf of the Symposia Committee, Don reported that Helen Siders planned to host a picnic in early October. It was the sense of the board that the picnic should not conflict with Austin City Limits on October 9 or Steve Harsh's memorial service.

Don led a discussion on news articles and the news schedule. In summary, there have been articles submitted but not printed without explanation to the submitters and there has been insufficient time for adequate proof-reading of the newsletters before they went to press. In summary, the discussion provided several examples to support the problems and several board members shared their experiences with similar problems, what worked in the past, what did not work, and how the current LSM process got to where it was today. It was the sense of the board that the concerns raised by submitters are serious and that the ComComm should explore the problems and recommend any process changes needed to resolve them by the next board meeting. The board provided the following two general guidelines:

--The newsletter is the primary communications vehicle to provide information on chapter activities to members. Proactive and continuous communications between the editors and submitters is essential if we want to continue to receive articles and calendar submissions. As a minimum the process should provide response to each submitter and if an article is not printed in the current issue communications should to let the submitter and publisher know why it was not printed and if and when the article would be printed.

--Newsletter content should be reasonably current and available to members. Currently submissions are due the second Thursday of each month and are mailed out the Friday after the fourth Thursday. Changes to the process should not require earlier submission or cause later mailing.

The next monthly board meeting will be Tuesday, September 7, at 6 PM at Ron Edelstein's house. The meeting adjourned at 7:14 PM.

#### Lone Star Mensa 2010-2011 Financial Report and Tables April 1 - June 30

Revenue continues to lag for the testing program. Other revenue items continue to be on budget. Expenses for the year are almost entirely for the Armadillo printing and postage, except that in June our scholarship winner was sent the \$400 check awarded. Other than that, for the fiscal quarter our other expenses have been for a few photocopies and printouts for reports to officers. RG revenue and registrations are a concern, as they are lagging behind totals at this point last year by a substantial amount.
